



As you know one of our priority areas is health. Jesus gave us many examples of how important people's health was to him. Over the years we have trained hundreds of women to be health promotors. They share their love by helping others prevent and cure different illnesses. One of the ways they help is to attend people along with US Medical Teams.

Medical Team to Ixtepec

Each year the Tennessee Medical Team invites the GYTTE Health Promotors to participate in the village of Ixtepec to share health themes with the people there. The village of Ixtepec is located in the Northern Mountains in the State of Puebla; it is an indigenous area and the people are very poor economically. Four Health Promotors and Veronica Palacios, the head of the GYTTE health program participated.



Before going to Ixtepec, GYTTE had to make many preparations such as: getting health materials ready, preparing flipcharts that contain diverse themes like; diabetes, diabetic foot, hypertension, general hygiene, disinfection of fruit and vegetables, hand washing, dental hygiene, etc.

We teach many health topics to people while they are waiting for their medical consult. At the end of each health class we distribute brochures to the those who were in the class.



With some of the health subjects we also offer a service; like in the hand-washing class, we invite people to wash their hands with water and soap while they are



waiting to be checked by a doctor. In the General Hygiene class, we offer to cut their hair and we also share soap. In the Dental Hygiene class, fluoride is applied on children's teeth and we distribute tooth-brushes for children and adults.

In the class about Disinfection of Fruit and Vegetables and Nutrition, Health Promotors prepare a plate with fruit and vegetables for each person.

In the Diabetes and Diabetic Foot classes, we test their glucose, in the class about Hypertension, we check people's blood pressure and make suggestions to lower it. Veronica brought good used clothes that they shared with needy mothers; especially children's clothes.



Some health problems that we detected were that many adults, and especially women, have malnutrition, high blood pressure, and older adults have long, thick toe nails. Many people are not used to washing their hands, so dirty hands are a major health problem.

It is very cold at all hours. Women use a very thin shawl. We could see there is a great need for warmer clothes like jackets for the women.
